## What is SEE?

The Streets to Employment and Education (SEE) Program invites young people to participate in a sixteen week program teaching transferrable job and life skills.

The purpose of the program is to enable youth to further their education and to equip them with skills and knowledge to help them succeed in future community employment/educational pursuits.

## Courses

### WOOD WORKING

Youth will have the opportunity to work, hands on, with carpentry tools and equipment — creating many saleable wooden products.

### ENTREPRENEURIAL

"Street Design" is our artistic enterprise program; giving youth access to the following creative and entrepreneurial equipment: silk screening materials, book binder, and pin/button press.

### FOOD PREPARATION

Program participants will have access to our "LunchBox" program, where they'll learn food preparation and food service skills.

### RETAIL SALES

Change4Change, oneROOF's on-campus thrift store, employs participants from The SEE Program to learn all the aspects of retail business (advertising, sorting, customer service, etc). In addition, the store allows for the retail sale of products, made by youth, in the "Wood Working" and "Street Design" programs.

## Why oneROOF's SEE Program?

Earn minimum wage while developing skills to help you obtain and maintain future employment.

Receive a \$500 completion bonus.

Get the support you need to return to school, prepare for your GED, or find permanent employment.

Leave with certifications in WHMIS, Safe Food Handling & CPR First Aid.

Receive support and mentorship both during and in the months following program graduation.

Leave ready to work — with employment skills, job experience, and work references.
